ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE

Summary of Administrative Activities as Assistant Director of Honors in the Major at Florida State University (August 2019 – Present) The Assistant Director of Honors in the Major (HITM) is responsible for the management of the honors thesis program and the support of thesis students and faculty directors. In this role I decisively collaborate with the Director of Honors and faculty leaders from across the university to amplify the HITM brand and to promote the honors thesis to undergraduates as a learning experience uniquely preparatory for post-graduate success. Two key goals animate this administrative work: the expansion of faculty and student participation rates; and the optimization of the thesis experience. For the former, I conduct campus outreach, departmental visits, and student recruitment events arranged in collaboration with faculty honors liaisons. For the latter, I use interactions with students and faculty mentors along with program data to identify barriers, partner with the Director of Honors to develop resources in response, and implement solutions. As products of my efforts, I have created tools new to the Honors landscape at Florida State University. One tool is the *Honors in the Major Handbook*, a 50-page comprehensive manual to help thesis students and faculty mentors navigate the HITM experience. Another tool is an HITM data set I built in 2020 that documents many key characteristics of the 1700+ honors theses completed at Florida State since 2009. Introducing

instructional resources and data analytics to the management of the HITM program has helped lay groundwork for equitable and sustainable program growth.

Summary of Administrative Activities as Academic Program Specialist for the Honors Capstone in the Honors College at University of Illinois, Chicago (March 2018 – June 2019)

This position reported to the Associate Dean of the Honors College and was responsible for the management of the Honors Capstone Project, an Honors College requirement in which Honors students conducted two semesters of independent and original research under the supervision of a faculty mentor that culminated in a signature senior project. The position was new and had been created in response to incoherent policy and practice surrounding the Capstone. In the role I streamlined Honors College policy regarding the Capstone; developed programming and resources specific to the Capstone including the authorship of the *UIC Honors Capstone Handbook*; implemented assessment tools for raising Capstone quality; and taught a class related to undergraduate research as a pipeline to post-graduation professional and academic success. I also served as academic advisor to Honors students and collaborated with faculty leaders to promote and support undergraduate research opportunities on campus.

Summary of Administrative Activities as Doctoral Advisor and Senior Doctoral Advisor at Capella University (July 2010 – March 2018)

This position reported to the Director of the Doctoral Support Center, and focused on team-based, intrusive, appreciative academic advising for 400+ doctoral students throughout the coursework, comprehensive examination, and dissertation/capstone phases of their programs. Advising occurred in a 100% online setting. Administrative responsibilities included decisive collaboration with faculty and staff to manage doctoral cohorts, in order to identify program design barriers, develop better student support resources, and implement holistic solutions, all with the goal of increasing student retention, persistence, and program completion.
